500 DEFINITION OF EMID STUDENT

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to clarify the identification of EMID students referenced in EMID policies and to clarify the relationship of the EMID policies to those of the member districts as they pertain to EMID students.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. All students attending integration programs at EMID are considered EMID students and are subject to and protected by the EMID policies and procedures.
- B. For integration programs occurring outside the school day or away from a member district site, the EMID policies regarding student and staff behavior and crisis management will take precedence over the member districts' policies as it would be impractical to track and follow multiple districts' policies and have different rules for different students.
- C. For integration programs occurring during the school day on-site in the students' member district, all attempts will be made to follow the member district's behavior and crisis policies and procedures.
- D. Regardless of location, incidents involving student behavior resulting in discipline, accidents or injuries, harassment, or other traumas will be reported immediately by the EMID staff to the student's building administrator.

III. DEFINITIONS

- A. An "EMID student" is any student who is:
 - 1. a resident K-12 student in one of our member districts or
 - 2. a resident K-12 student in a non-member district or charter school; and
 - 3. a participant in one or more of the EMID integration programs.

Students from non-member districts may purchase places in certain integration programs without their district's participation if they are able to provide their own



transportation either to the EMID program site or to a pick-up location in a member district.
