903 VISITORS TO EMID INTEGRATION PROGRAM LOCATIONS

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to inform the school community and the general public about visitors to EMID integration program locations.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. The Board encourages interest on the part of parents and community members in integration programs and student activities. The Board welcomes visits by parents and community members provided the visits are consistent with the health, education and safety of students and are conducted within procedures established by EMID.
- B. The Board reaffirms its position on the importance of maintaining a learning environment that is safe for students and employees and free of activity that may be disruptive to the student learning process.

III. RESPONSIBILITY

- A. EMID administration shall develop visitor procedures and requirements for review and approval of the Executive Director. Upon approval, such procedures and requirements shall be considered as an addendum to this policy.
- B. It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Director to provide the necessary procedures to implement this policy.

IV. VISITORS LIMITATIONS

- A. An individual or group may be denied permission to visit an integration program location or such permission may be revoked if the visitor(s) does not comply with EMID procedures and regulations or if the visit is not, as determined solely by EMID, in the best interest of students, employees or the district.
- B. Visitors are authorized to park vehicles at integration program locations at times and in locations specified in the approved visitor procedures and requirements which are an addendum to this policy or as otherwise specifically authorized by EMID officials. When unauthorized vehicles of visitors are parked at integration program locations officials may:



1. move the vehicle or require the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle to remove it; or
 2. if unattended, provide for the removal of the vehicle, at the expense of the owner or operator off of the property of the integration program.
- C. An individual or group who enters integration program locations without complying with the procedures and requirements may be guilty of criminal trespass and thus subject to criminal penalty. Such persons may be detained by the integration program supervisor or designee in a reasonable manner pending the arrival of a police officer.
