ynergy from Forest Lake High School were invited to perform and present their work at an information table at the Minnesota chapter of the National Association for Multicultural Education (MN-NAME). MN-NAME is a non-profit organization comprised of educators, activists, parents, non-profit folks, and others committed to equity, social justice, and multicultural education.

The performance is a spoken word poetry piece created by the Synergy ensemble, a student-led group that uses artistic expression as a platform to create and inspire community change.
